What is REPOPSI?

A collection of Open-Access psychological instruments (items, scales, questionnaires, tests...)

First centralized repository of psychological instruments that have been translated into Serbian and/or adapted for the Serbian population and/or developed by Serbian scientists

At the moment, provides access to **178** instruments

Established and maintained by researchers and students at the Laboratory for Research of Individual Differences, Faculty of Philosophy University of Belgrade

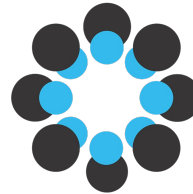
Members of other institutions can also submit their original instruments/translations

Why?

To avoid overlapping translation efforts & save resources

To make existing translations more easily findable & reusable

To increase the visibility of original instruments developed by local researchers

For what?

Participating in large multi-site collaborations

Teaching psychometrics (theory & methods of psychological measurement)

Opening tools to make the research process more transparent & reproducible (scientific articles, theses)

For whom?

Local & international scientists (92/178 instruments available in both Serbian & English)

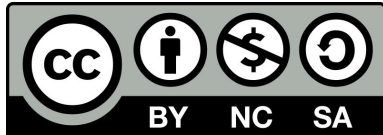

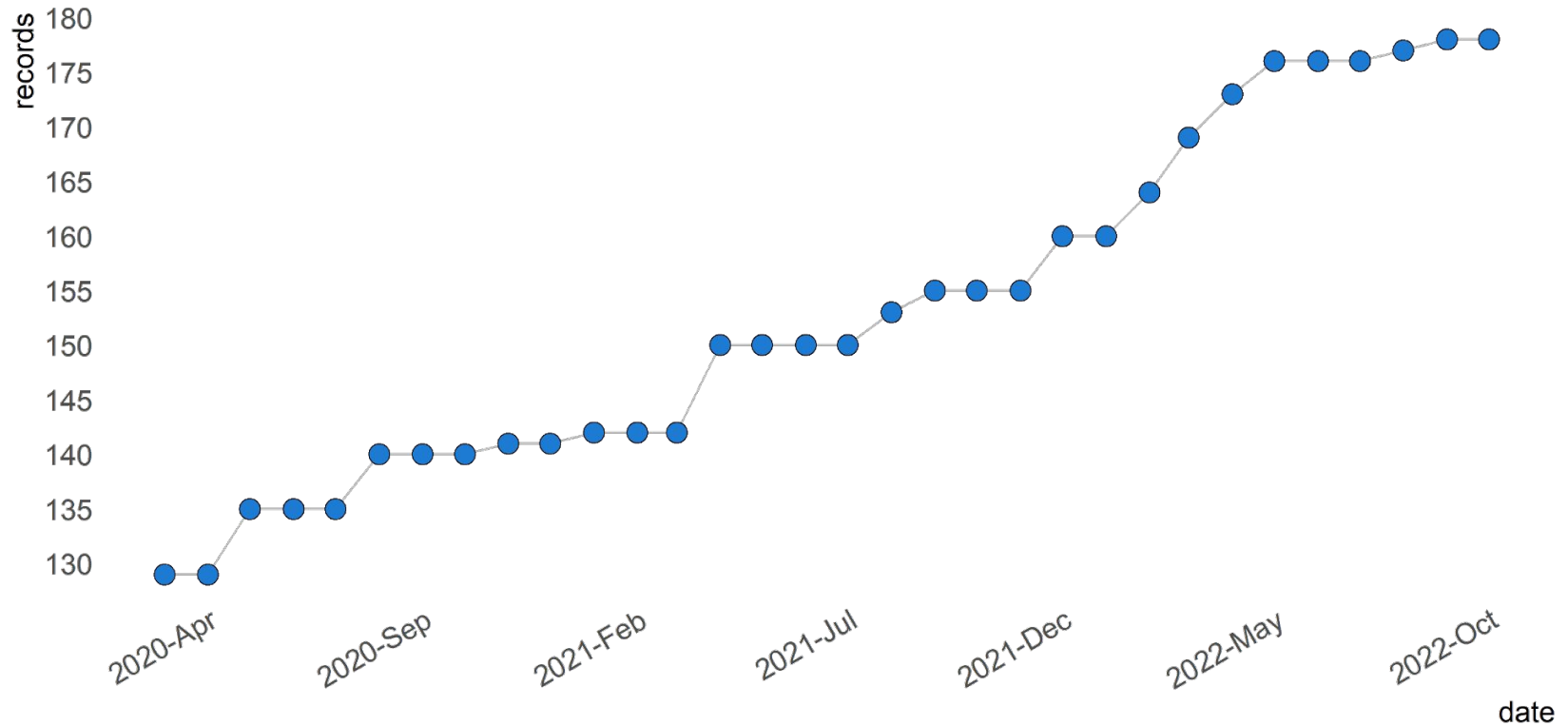

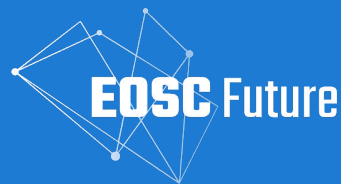
What's next for REPOPSI?
